Worked for Stanley Kubrick in the early 70's, as an assistant editor of *Ambit Magazine* and for the photographer Eve Arnold. Also ran a stall on the Portobello road. Began producing small Letterpress edition books in 1986.

Represented in the Victoria and Albert Museum and MOMA. Paintings in the Tate Gallery London, The British Council and The Contemporary Art Society. Photographs in the National Portrait Gallery.

Visiting lecturer to MA Students in Book illustration at Falmouth University since 2003.
